Hold Request Statuses

We've had several questions lately about what the Hold Status terms mean once you've placed an item

on hold in our catalog. We thought we would share some context about how our system processes your

request. Please feel free to ask us with any other questions you may have!



HOLD STATUSES:



Congratulations! Your hold request has been placed, and an item that matches your request is available now at one or more GMILCS libraries.



Library staff have retrieved your item from the shelf, and put the item in a bin to be delivered to the pick up location that you requested.



Your item is ready for you at the pick up location! You can check out your item during that library's open hours, by presenting your library card.

ADDITIONAL POSSIBLE HOLD STATUSES:



ACTIVE

Your hold has been placed, and when an item becomes available, it will be pulled for you and shipped to your pick up location.

(Usually for items which are currently checked out but can fill your request when returned.)

INACTIVE

A hold placed with a future activation date, which will become Active or Pending when the activation date is reached.

(You can place future holds so that an item will be located for you after you return from vacation, for example!)

CANCELLED

The user or library staff cancelled the hold, or the item was delivered to your pick up location, but was not picked up.

(For example, items are Held at Nesmith Library for 5 days before being returned to their home library.)

March Adult Programming



With the weirdly warm weather we've been having. March may or may not come in like a lion. Remember that 65 degree day on February 23 and the snow storm two days later? Who knows what March will bring!?! Well, we do know March will bring Daylight Savings Time (turn your clocks ahead one hour before you go to bed on Saturday the 12th). St. Patrick's Day on Thursday the 17th, and the first day of spring on Sunday the 20th! We've got some great new titles from bestselling authors coming out this month: a thriller, The Golden Couple, by Greer Hendricks and Sarah Pekkanen; an historical fiction novel based on a true story, The Diamond Eye, by Kate Quinn; and a multigenerational saga, French Braid, by Anne Tyler. All of these are already listed in our catalog and ready for you to put on hold. If you need help putting an item on hold, just give us a call, and we can walk you through it, or do it for you.

Nesmith Library Book Group

The Nesmith Library Book Group will meet in person on Wednesday, March 9 at 6:00 p.m. This month we've been reading *The Dictionary of Lost Words* by Pip Williams. If you didn't have a chance to read the book, no worries! Come to the meeting and start with our next book (title to be revealed shortly!) and mark your

calendar. We typically meet every second Wednesday of the month at 6:00 p.m. To participate, you must have a Nesmith Library card or a card from one of the libraries in our consortium, you need to be over the age of 16, and you must register.



Black Bear Happenings



The black bear is one of New Hampshire's largest and most majestic mammals. On Thursday, March 10 at 6:00 p.m., we will learn (in person!) about their history from Don Allen, Fish and Wildlife Steward, with the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department. The presence of the black bear in modern New Hampshire is a wildlife restoration success story. In the 18th, 19th, and early 20th centuries, the black bear

was reviled as a varmint, so aggressive land clearing, bounties, and zero hunting regulations depleted their numbers to just 500 by the year 1900. However, the combination of science-based wildlife management, research, and carefully regulated hunting has allowed the state's bear population to grow to nearly 5,000 animals just in the past decade. Now they can be found in all counties of New Hampshire! Come and hear the story of the black bear coming back from the edge of being lost to New Hampshire.

Special Vacation Storytime



Video Games and Craft Wednesday, March 16 3:30 p.m.


Grades 4-8. Registration required. In person.
