our project. We are still hoping for the project work to be done this year.



May Adult Programming

Happy Mother's Day, and we welcome the unofficial start of summer with Memorial Day! We've got some great new titles coming out this month: The Book Woman's Daughter by Kim Michele Richardson, the sequel to the bestselling The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek: Meant to Be by Emily Giffin, an against-all-odds love story; and Remarkably Bright Creatures by Shelby Van Pelt, that the publisher describes as a "charming, witty and compulsively readable exploration of friendship, reckoning, and hope that traces a widow's unlikely connection with a giant Pacific octopus." All of these are already listed in our catalog and ready for you to put on hold. If you need help putting an item on hold, just give us a call and we can walk you through it or do it for you.

Library Book Group

The Nesmith Library Book Group will meet in person on Wednesday, May 11 at 6:00 p.m. This month we've been reading Rock Paper Scissors by Alice Feeney. If you didn't have a chance to read the book, no worries! Come to the meeting and start with our next book (title to be revealed shortly!) and mark your calendar. We typically meet every second Wednesday of the month at 6:00 p.m. In order to participate, you must have a Nesmith Library card or a card from one of the libraries

in our consortium, you need to be over the age of 16, and you must register.

N.H. Civil War Monuments



New Hampshire towns did not erect monuments to prior wars, but the emotional and family toll, unprecedented in American history, drove the decision to honor our local soldiers and sailors of the Civil War. On Thursday, May 5 at 6:30 p.m., local historian George Morrison will take us on a tour of these memorials during Vanished Veterans: New Hampshire Civil War Monuments and Memorials, a New Hampshire Humanities program, co-hosted by the Windham Historical Society. From Seabrook to Colebrook, Berlin to Hinsdale, along Main Streets and 19th-century dirt roads, in city parks and on town greens, in libraries and town halls, and in cemeteries prominent and obscure, Mr. Morrison located, inventoried, and photographed the fascinating variety of New Hampshire's Civil War memorials. He shares his discoveries, from the earliest obelisks, to statuary and artillery, to murals, cast iron, stained glass, and buildings from the 1860s through the 1920s.

First-born son of a navalaviator-turned-marine-biologist and a librarian, George Morrison's first grade teacher had him lecture in middle school science classes. When his favorite sixth grade teacher predicted he'd become either a teacher or priest, he was unconvinced. After earning a B.A., History, UNH, 1982, he served 30 years as a high school teacher. A long-time researcher of unpublished primary sources, he has contributed to the work of aviation historians and artists in several countries. A life-long photographer, historian, and motorcyclist, he traveled over 18,000 miles in the course of this project, which was sparked after noticing a puzzling 1918 monument inscription. This program is made possible through a grant from New Hampshire Humanities.

others eager to learn. In April 2016, Steve formed Open World Explorers to more fully share his knowledge and experiences in ecology, ornithology, and Earth science, and to help others find personal value in the natural history and landscape of the area.
