Wednesday, September 25, at 6:00 p.m., when historian and author Glenn Knoblock will delve into the history of the "Kanc." The highway, which runs between Conway and Lincoln and through the towns of Albany and Waterville Valley, was fully opened in 1967, but the development of the highway itself took over 120 years to become a reality. Located in the Swift River Valley for much of its length, the Kancamagus is the gateway to the southern White Mountains and is not only renowned for its fall foliage views. but such celebrated natural sites as Sabbaday Falls, Lower Falls, and Rocky Gorge, to name just a few. This program is made possible through a grant from New Hampshire Humanities.



Windham Cemetery on the Plains Icons and Iconography Tour

Do you love history? Are you curious about cemeteries? Do you like to wander among gravestones? Then meet us at Windham's Cemetery on the Plains on Saturday, September 28, at 1:00 p.m. for an engaging and informative tour led by local researcher, librarian, author, and cemetery sleuth

Erin E. Moulton. The town cemetery is akin to a museum. It's a community time capsule, showcasing art, artifacts, and stories. Erin will help us unearth icons and iconography of Windham's



past. We'll explore grave sites of early Scots, Irish settlers, Windham veterans, teachers, firefighters, and nurses. We'll mull the meaning of the symbols and epitaphs that we see along the way and do a scavenger hunt as we go. Meet at the Cemetery on the Plains located at 5 Cobbetts Pond Road in Windham. Dress for the weather and wear comfortable shoes. If the weather is truly terrible and forces us to cancel, we will email registrants. This program is for ages 10 and up, and registration is required. Space

is limited, so register early!

Great Boston Fires

Join us virtually on Zoom, Monday, September 30, at 7:00 p.m. when author and historian David Kruh will be looking at Boston's devastating fires and their impact on the city. David will talk about the many "great" fires of the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries (including the truly Great Fire of 1872) and delve into the infamous Cocoanut Grove tragedy of 1942 (which killed 492) and the Hotel Vendome fire of 1972 (which resulted in the deaths of nine fire fighters). How did these fires happen? What was learned from these events? What, if anything, was done to try and prevent similar catastrophes? David's newest slide show, filled with images from these events, answers these and other questions. The program is presented with Ashland Public Library.



Ages 0-18 months. Registration not required.


All babies and their caregivers are invited to join us Wednesday mornings at the Nesmith Library for Baby Sto-

Preschool Storytime


Thursdays, Sept. 12 – October 17 10:30 a.m.


