New Book Releases

Here are a few of the books releasing in August. Casey McQuiston, author of Red, White, and Royal Blue, is back with The Pairing on August 6. On August 1, The Thirteenth Husband by Greer Macallister tells the fictionalized story of the real-life heiress Aimee Crocker, a woman who tore "through millions of dollars, four continents, and a hearty collection of husbands." This month there are also a few thrillers: The Perfect Son by Freida McFadden (August 6), Talking to Strangers by Fiona Barton (August 27), I Need You to Read This by Jessa Maxwell (August 13), and Someone in the Attic by Andrea Mara (August 20). Virtual World of Vermeer

Johannes Vermeer, who created the iconic painting "The Girl with the Pearl Earring," is considered a world renowned



Dutch Master of the 17th century. That painting is one of only 37 works of his that scholars believe survive today, and back in 2023, for the first time ever, 28 of those 37 pieces were exhibited at the Riiksmuseum in Amsterdam. Join us virtually, on Thursday, August 1 at 10:30 a.m. to study his quiet, luminous interiors that seem to capture the daily life of ordinary people in his hometown of Delft, and to hear about the latest insights into this beloved but enigmatic artist. Mary Woodward, an art historian and guide at several historic New England properties, will lead this program. Mary previously served as public programs coordinator and educator at the Concord Museum. This program is presented with the Tewksbury (Mass.) Public Library.

Mediumship Gallery

Join us on Thursday, August 1 at 6:00 p.m. for a truly exceptional program. Psychic medium, Carissa Sikora will be offering a mediumship gallery, during which she invites in and connects with Spirit loved ones to relay messages. Virtual Summer Adventures: Art Colonies in New England



Virtual Armchair Travel to Greece with the Traveling Librarian



Join us in person or on Zoom when we welcome Jeff Klapes, the Traveling Librarian, on Tuesday, August 27 at 10:30 a.m. Travel to Rhodes and Svmi. two iewels of the Dodecanese islands in the eastern Aegean, both of which captivate visitors with their distinct charms. Rhodes boasts a rich history, its ancient ruins and medieval Old Town echoing tales of knights and ancient civilizations. Meanwhile, tiny nearby Symi enchants with its colorful neoclassical architecture cascading down hillsides to azure waters below. Both islands offer pristine beaches, delectable cuisine, and warm hospitality, making them quintessential destinations for cultural exploration and seaside relaxation in the Greek isles. Jeff is the recently retired head of reference services at the Lucius Beebe Memorial Library in Wakefield and an avid traveler and photographer. On Thursday, August 29 at 10:30 a.m., both on Zoom and in person, we will examine his extraordinary life and many of his important works. His friend and sometime rival Pablo Picasso once said, "All things considered, there is only Matisse."



Led by Janet Mandel, a retired 32-year art history teacher, who now presents illustrated talks on a variety of art history topics at colleges and universities, libraries, museums, senior centers, and community centers. Summer Teen Happenings


