August Book Preview

This month I am going to highlight books that are the start of a new series.

He Falls First by Jill Shalvis – Book 1 in the Colburn Brothers series (August 5): "One thing's for sure, she's never falling in love again. Not even with the sexy, snarky contractor who keeps testing the walls she's built."

Warrior Princess Assassin by Brigid Kemmerer – Book 1 in the Braided Fate series (August 12): "Fates collide and passions ignite in The New York Times best-selling author Brigid Kemmerer's steamy adult fantasy debut about three characters torn between chasing, betraying, and craving each other: a princess caught between duty and desire, the fearsome warrior king she's promised to, and the assassin tasked with hunting them down."

Fall I Want by Lyra Parish – Book 1 in the Cozy Creek series (August 19): "This is a feel-good, spicy small-town, romantic comedy with a billionaire who falls first and harder."

Love's a Witch by Tricia O'Malley – Book 1 in the Scottish Charms series (August 26): "A cozy romantasy about a witch returning to Scotland to break a family curse — only to clash with one grumpy Scotsman determined to protect his town from her haywire magic."

Mrs. Christie at the Mystery Guild Library by Amanda Chapman – Book 1 in the Mrs. Christie series (August 26): "Book conservator Tory Van Dyne and a woman claiming to be Agatha Christie on holiday from the Great Beyond join forces to catch a killer in this spirited mystery."

Eyes on Owls



Everyone loves owls! Yet, how often do you get to see an owl up close? You will on Saturday, August 2 at 1:00 p.m.

when teacher/naturalist Marcia Wilson and author/photographer/naturalist Mark Wilson bring us their passion for owls! Mark and Marcia will share the field marks, signs, and naturalist's skills that you can use to find wild owls without disturbing them. Next, you'll meet six live owls (from small to huge) up close. Everyone participates in a hooting lesson and learns tips on how to attract and protect owls near you. Chances are you'll meet New England's tiniest owl, the Northern Sawwhet Owl (weighing in at 4 ounces), along with the world's largest owl, the Eurasian Eagle Owl (check out that five foot wingspan)! The owls work best with ages three and older. For the safety and comfort of our owls, we just ask that any children that get restless be brought out of the room by their caregivers until they settle. No registration required.


Marcia and Mark Wilson founded Eyes On Owls in 1994 as an educational enterprise that brings wild owls to schools or groups, so you can learn more about your wild neighbors and their habitats. The owls they care for at Eyes On Owls are permanently disabled - that is they can't survive on their own in the wild. Many of the owls are survivors of collisions with vehicles. They give each owl a safe, clean, low-stress home. They have federal and state permits to display the owls for educational programs. The owls ARE NOT pets. Their owls have sharp talons and beaks, special dietary and health requirements, as well as special housing they custom build for each bird. For example, non-flighted owls get accessibility ramps in their aviaries.

Museums of the Vatican



Many visitors to the Vatican are drawn to Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel ceiling and Raphael's Papal Rooms, but the Vatican museums hold a wealth of art and history from ancient times to the present day.

On Thursday, August 14 at 10:30 a.m., we will explore highlights from the classical sculpture collection and from the Old Masters painting collection, as well as view contemporary religious art. We will also examine the various stages in the painting of the Sistine Chapel and the Raphael Rooms. Join us on Zoom or in person at the library to see one of the finest collections of art in the world!

Led by art historian Martha Chiarchiaro, owner of Seeing History, this program will also be shown in person at the library at the same time. No registration required to join us in person.

Teen Mend-It Circle





1,000 Books Before Kindergarten

The Nesmith Library staff would like to congratulate Beckham and Will for completing our 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Program!
These two got their own graduation caps, a certificate, and a free book. Beckham and Will both worked hard collecting patches for their bags!
These two will soon be kindergarteners, and we cannot wait to see them as they continue to grow.

The goal of the program is simple: read 1,000 books with your child before they start kindergarten. It might sound overwhelming, but breaking it down into daily reading makes it achievable:

- 1 book per day for 1 year = 365 books
- 1 book per day for 3 yrs = 1,095 books
- 1 book per day for 5 yrs = 1,825 books

We're here to help you every step of the way, offering tools to track your progress, stay motivated, and celebrate milestones!
