New Book Releases

There are some great new books hitting the shelf in February. The Fox Wife by Yangsze Choo (Feb. 13) is a story of "old loves and second chances, the depths of maternal love, and ancient folktales that may very well be true." The Hidden Life of Cecily Larson by Ellen Baker (Feb. 20) tells the story of 94-year-old Cecily, who was abandoned at 4, and how a recently taken DNA test "throws into question everything about the family she's raised and claimed as her own for nearly 70 years." And finally, The Deerfield Massacre: A Surprise Attack, a Forced March, and the Fight for Survival in Early America by James Swanson (Feb. 27) is a true telling of the 1704 attack in Massachusetts, when Indians and their French allies slaughtered or captured the small outpost's inhabitants. The Globemakers



Join us virtually via Zoom on Thursday, Feb. 22, at 2:00 p.m. when Peter Bellerby, founder of Bellerby & Co. Globemakers, takes us on a visual tour through the history of globemaking: how it almost became a lost art: and how he is bringing it back, one beautiful hand-painted globe at a time. His book, The Globemakers: The Curious Story of an Ancient Craft, is a full-color photographic portrait of a fantastic art and an enlightening exploration of globes, or "earth apples," as they were first known. When Peter set out to make a globe for his father's 80th birthday, after failing to find a suitable one to purchase, he had no idea where the process would lead. He went on to establish Bellerby & Co, one of the only artisan globemakers in the world. The Globemakers brings us inside Peter's gorgeous studio to learn how he and his team of cartographers and artists bring these stunning objects to life. Presented in conjunction with Ashland (Mass.) Radon Awareness



How much radon is safe for your family to breathe? Tom Jarvela, the founder of radonlibrary.com, will be here on Thursday, Feb. 22 at 6:00 p.m. to answer this question and talk about radon and how you can test for it in your home. Tom found that he and his family were breathing VERY elevated levels of radon, a radioactive, naturally occurring, colorless, and odorless gas. Long term exposure to radon increases the risk of lung cancer, and the only way to know if the air in your home is safe is to test for radon. Nationally, it is estimated that 1 of every 15 homes has elevated levels of radon, but in New Hampshire, it is estimated that 3 in 10 homes have elevated radon. Join us to learn more about the importance of testing for radon and how to test your home for FREE!

Tom Jarvela is a New Hampshire native who currently lives in Stratham with his wife and two young children. An outdoor enthusiast, you'll often find him running and biking on the trails around the seacoast. He spent years promoting sustainable commuting in the greater seacoast region as a member of the Commute Smart Seacoast advisory board. In 2021, his family discovered that their home had very elevated levels of radon. Having remediated their own radon issues, he founded radonlibrary.com, an organization dedicated to working collaboratively with libraries to promote radon awareness in the Granite State.
