



Banjos, Bones, and Ballads



Join us on Thursday, July 6 at 3:00 p.m. when folklorist Jeff Warner will play tavern songs, banjo tunes, 18th century New England hymns, and sailor songs, and tell humorous stories about traditional singers and their music. This New Hampshire Humanities program is for ages 10 and up, and registration is required.

Traditional songs, rich in local history and a sense of place, present the latest news from the distant past, and help us to interpret present-day life with an understanding of the working people who built our country.

Jeff Warner connects 21st century audiences with the music and everyday lives of 19th century people. He presents musical traditions from the lumber camps of the Adirondack Mountains and the whaling ports of New England to the Outer Banks fishing villages of North Carolina. Warner accompanies his songs on concertina, banjo, guitar, and several pocket instruments, such as bones and spoons. He is a folklorist and community scholar for the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts, and a former State Arts Council fellow.

He has toured nationally for the Smithsonian Institution and has recorded for Flying Fish, Rounder Records, and other labels.

Known as "America's favorite illustrator," Norman Rockwell is best known for his relatable scenes of modern American life with subjects selected for their broad appeal: families, holiday celebrations, and young love. Rockwell was also fond of making paintings about painting and the art world in general, topics one wouldn't necessarily associate with commercial art for the middle class.

On Thursday, July 20 at 7:00 p.m., join the Nesmith Library in conjunction with other GMILCS libraries for the fourth event in our Culturallly Curious Art Series with Jane Oneail. This virtual Zoom program considers the various ways Rockwell explored art making and museums over the course of his career, with a healthy dose of the artist's good humor.

Food Preservation and Fermentation Workshop

Join us at the Nesmith Library on Wednesday, July 26 at 6:00 p.m. for a class on food preservation, where we will learn the principles of fermentation. Emily Makrez, owner of F-Word Farm and educator on all things fermenting, farming, and foraging related, will show you how to pickle what's in season to make the most of your harvest and prevent food waste.

The demonstration will include the basic principles of fermentation, so you will leave with the knowledge and confidence to be able to safely ferment practically anything! Emily will also

touch on the benefits of lactofermented food and how adding these foods to our diets are a benefit to our overall health.



Emily Makrez is the owner of F-Word Farm, a place for farming, foraging, and fermenting. Her interest in food took her to Seattle to pursue a master's degree in nutrition at Bastyr University, but her love of New England brought her back home to start her own farm and delve deeply into the world of fermentation and foraging. Emily's focus is on using every last bit of what nature provides and making it taste delicious.

Wildlife Photography with Martin Culpepper



If you love wildlife, photography, or both, join us on Wednesday, August 2 at 6:00 p.m. when photographer Martin Culpepper shares his breathtaking animal photos with us. In addition to showing his photographs and hearing the stories behind them, Martin will cover the foundations of how to take

Rain or shine, it's sure to be a great time with the start of the Teen Summer Reading Program!




To keep things lowkey during the holiday week we have a **Teen Donut Takeaway Craft** on Wednesday, July 5, while supplies last.




