Virtual Armchair Travel to Barcelona

Over 19 million visitors a year go to Barcelona for its vibrant culture, architectural marvels, beautiful beaches, amazing food, and much more! Join us either in person or via Zoom on Tuesday, July 2 at 10:30 a.m. to see the sights from a recent visit, and to learn how history and geography make the Catalan region unlike any other part of Spain. Led by Gene Flynn, an



Illinois native, who has taught at the College of Lake County and Harper College, and who serves on the board of the Institute for Continued Learning at Roosevelt University. He frequently gives travel presentations to libraries and senior centers around the country. This virtual program is presented with Tewksbury (Mass.) Public Library, and will also be shown at the library, where light refreshments will be served. No registration is required to attend the inperson screening.

Bata Shoe Museum: A Virtual Tour

Feet are the same around the world, but what we wear can be so different! On Monday, July 8 at 7:00 p.m., discover the many different types of shoes worn throughout the ages during our virtual tour (on Zoom) of Toronto's Bata Shoe Museum. As the only museum in North America dedicated to footwear. the Bata Shoe Museum showcases 4,500 years of history and nearly 15,000 artifacts in its collection. During our tour we will experience four different exhibitions including All About Shoes: Footwear Through the Ages; In Bloom: Flowers and Footwear; Dressed to Impress: Footwear and Consumerism in the 1980s; Exhibit A: Investigating Crime and Footwear. So, put on your footwear of choice and join us for this visually appealing and historically interesting tour! Along the way, we'll also learn about the museum's fascinating

architecture and the special designs incorporated to spotlight footwear. This program is presented with Ashland (Mass.) Public Library.

Virtual Armchair Travel to Greece

On Tuesday, July 9 at 10:30 a.m., join us virtually on Zoom when Jeff Klapes, the Traveling Librarian, tells us about his travels to Chios, a Greek island in the eastern Aegean, which captivates with its diverse landscapes and rich history. The island is renowned for its unique mastic gum cultivation, a tradition dating back to ancient times. Visitors can explore UNESCO-listed monasteries and castles, and enjoy local delicacies like mastiha-flavored sweets. Virtual Two Nerdy Girls



A retired high school teacher, he previously served as president of the Greater Lynn Photographic Association and gallery manager of the Loading Dock Gallery in Lowell. Virtual Paris 1874



On April 15, 1874, in Paris, an exhibition opened that would launch one of the most famous artistic movements in the world: impressionism. On Thursday, July 18 at 10:30 a.m. in

person or via Zoom, we'll hear about the first time Monet, Renoir, Degas. Morisot, Pissarro, Cezanne, and Sisley came together independently to exhibit their work: light-filled, colorful paintings conveying fleeting impressions with a brisk and lively touch. In doing so, these artists distanced themselves from the official Salon, the major official exhibition that dominated the Paris artistic life and the guardian of academic tradition. What happened over the course of those few weeks? Through a selection of works shown at the exhibition of these independent artists and at the official Salon, Musée d'Orsay proposed a revival of it for its 150th anniversary. Examine the exhibitions of both 1874 and 2024 with Patrick Herpe, a French tour guide Zooming live from Europe. This virtual program is presented with Tewksbury Public Library, and will also be shown at the library. Light refreshments will be served. No registration required to attend the in-person screening.

Monadnock Falconry



Monadnock Falconry offers the chance for nature enthusiasts of all ages to imagine life as a bird of prey. On Saturday, July 20 at 1:30 p.m., we'll welcome Mahood and his handler for a live flight demonstration! This hour-long program offers the opportunity to meet a Harris' Hawk and see it on the wing, while answering questions about their life and their relationship with their human handlers. Monadnock Falconry is devoted to environmental education through first-hand experience of these amazing creatures rarely encountered up close in the wild. The program is open to all ages, and we'll begin in the Multipurpose Room before heading outside for a flight demonstration.

Virtual True Crime Author

We love true crime, and author Dean Jobb's new book, A Gentleman and a Thief: The Daring Jewel Heists of a Jazz Age Rogue, hits all the right notes! It's Catch Me If You Can meets The Great Gatsby meets Cary Grant in To Catch a Thief! Dean will join us via Zoom on Monday, July 22 at 7:00 p.m. to talk about his captivating Jazz Age true-crime caper and tell us the story of Arthur Barry, "the greatest jewel thief who ever lived." This program is presented with Ashland Public Library.

The Genius of Judy: How Judy Blume Rewrote Childhood for Us

Join us virtually via Zoom on Tuesday, July 23 at 7:00 p.m. when we'll be chatting with author Rachelle Bergstein whose book, The Genius of Judy: How Judy Blume Rewrote Childhood for All of Us, is about one of our favorite literacy warriors, as well as an author so many of us grew up with. As a mother of two searching for purpose outside of her home in 1960s suburban New Jersey, Blume wrote books starring regular children with genuine thoughts and problems. But behind those deceptively simple tales. Blume explored the pillars of the growing women's rights movement in which girls and women were entitled to careers, bodily autonomy, fulfilling relationships, and even sexual pleasure. Blume wasn't trying to be a revolutionary-she just wanted to tell honest stories-but in doing so, she created a cohesive, culture-altering vision of modern adolescence. How did she impact your life? How does she fight the good fight to keep books available and accessible to all? How has she become the icon that she is? Discuss everything Judy Blume with us and discover for yourself! This program is presented with Ashland Public Library.

Fused Glass Workshop

What is fused glass and how do we use it to craft? Come find out on Wednesday, July 24 at 6:00 p.m., when Nancy Perkins of True Colors Glassworks will teach us how to create unique art using colorful glass. We will learn the basics of fused glass colorwork, and arrange bits of glass on a 3"x3" base. No previous experience or



skills needed, and all materials will be provided! Nancy will supply stencils to help in the design process, or you can create your own pattern using freehand. This

workshop is for Nesmith Library card holders ages 18 and up, and registration is required.

Virtual Maxfield Parrish



Third time's a charm for this rescheduled program! Working in the first half of the 20th century, the New Hampshire artist Maxfield Parrish skyrocketed to success as an illustrator with his distinct saturated hues and neoclassical themes. On Monday, July 29 at 6:00 p.m., we welcome back (virtually via Zoom) art educator Jane Oneail to give us an overview of the artist's life, inspiration, and artistic output. Maxfield's prolific career helped to shape the Golden Age of Illustration in the US, and his fantastic landscapes and ethereal figures transported audiences to other realms.

Best-Selling Romance Authors

Icons of the romance genre, Christina Dodd and Susan Elizabeth Phillips are joining us virtually via Zoom on Tuesday, July 30, at 7:00 p.m. for a rollicking fun conversation about Christina's latest release, *A Daughter of Fair Verona*, a frothy, irreverent, witty new series with an irresistible premise—Romeo and Juliet's daughter as a clever, rebellious, fiercely independent young woman in fair Verona—told from the delightfully engaging point of

view of the captivating Rosie Montague herself. Of course, being Christine and Susan, they will also talk about books, romance, writing, tomfoolery, and whatever comes up. We hope you can join us for this very special event. We are just planning to sit back and enjoy the show! This virtual program is presented with Ashland Public Library.

Corbin's Animal Garden



Did you know in the late 1800s, banking, railroad, and real estate mogul Austin Corbin returned to his hometown of Newport, New Hampshire, built a grand estate and bought out his neighbors' farms to create a 22,000-acre wildlife game preserve stocked with boar, bison, bighorn sheep, and other imported animals? On Wednesday, July 31, at 2:00 p.m., come hear the story of Corbin's Animal Garden! New Hampshire Humanities presenter Mary Kronenwetter will discuss how the grounds eventually became a prestigious private hunting park and hosted illustrious quests including Theodore Roosevelt, the Prince of Wales, Cornelius Vanderbilt, and Joe Dimaggio. Mary's illustrated slideshow features archival images and she'll discuss the complicated history and legacy of New Hampshire's own Gilded Age robber baron. Her talk will also highlight the important legacy of the role the Corbin family and park naturalist Ernest Baynes played in saving American bison from extinction.

Summer Teen Happenings


